Celebrate art, heritage, and cultural diversity at HIDDEN Rookwood Sculptures 2023

Metropolitan Memorial Parks is pleased to announce the return of HIDDEN Rookwood Sculptures 2023 at Australia's largest cemetery, Rookwood General Cemetery. Celebrating its 13th anniversary, the annual HIDDEN event blends the richness of heritage, tradition, and multicultural narratives of Rookwood Cemetery with the creative expressions of diverse artists. The 2023 exhibition will be open from 21 October to 19 November, and will feature an array of contemporary and traditional art forms against the peaceful backdrop of the historic cemetery.

Dr Kath Fries, curator, HIDDEN 2023, said, "Rookwood Cemetery is more than a final resting place; it's a sacred space rich in cultural heritage and traditions.

The annual HIDDEN Rookwood Sculptures event lets us invite the community into this unique

setting, and foster the contemplation, remembrance, and appreciation of art, culture, and life. Whether you are drawn to the historical significance, personal stories, or the evocative sense of place of Rookwood Cemetery, HIDDEN 2023 promises to be an engaging and reflective event."

This year's exhibition is also proud to include the Stonemasons and Schools categories, augmenting the long-standing Sculptures section. These additional categories will highlight creativity across generations, from school children and teenagers to apprentices and professional artists. The Stonemasons category brings traditional hand-carving skills to the fore, while the Schools category will provide a platform for budding young artists.

The main Sculptures category will feature 30 works of art, from vibrant, celebratory pieces to contemplative, thought-provoking installations. The sculptures aim to explore various HIDDEN themes such as history, culture, remembrance, diversity, love, loss, mourning, spirituality, relationships, memory, community, life cycles, and the passage of time.

Entry to HIDDEN Rookwood Sculptures 2023 is free and visitors can explore the exhibition daily from sunrise to sunset. A complimentary informative audio tour and map are available, with a full-colour printed catalogue for sale to support restoration projects undertaken by the Friends of Rookwood. The exhibition experience is enhanced with curator tours, artist talks, and a public photography competition.

Leading up to the exhibition, Metropolitan Memorial Parks will host community workshops at the Granville Centre, Cumberland City Council, from July to September. A HIDDEN Satellite Exhibition will also open at the McGlade Gallery, ACU Strathfield on 14 October, one week before the main event at Rookwood Cemetery.

HIDDEN is honoured to continue its partnerships with Dharug Strategic Management Group, Cumberland City Council, and the Friends of Rookwood.

HIDDEN Rookwood Sculptures will run from 21 October to 19 November 2023.
